Overview

General Information

- The funds used to pay UCFE and Unemployment Compensation for Exservicemembers (UCX) benefits are advanced by the Department of Labor (DOL) to the states through the Federal Employment Compensation (FEC) Account.
- The FEC Account is a revolving account at the Department of the Treasury that is used to pay benefits for the UCFE and UCX programs.
- Federal agencies must reimburse the FEC Account for all UCFE and UCX benefits paid to eligible individuals.



Billing Process

- States draw funds down from the FEC Account to pay UCFE benefits.
- Quarterly states submit the Statement of Expenditures of Federal Funds for Reimbursable Unemployment Compensation Benefits Paid to UCFE Claimants (ETA-191) to DOL.
- DOL aggregates the benefit payments by federal agency.
- On the 20th day of the second month following the ended quarter, DOL provides the aggregate bill to the federal agencies.
- DOL notifies the Department of the Treasury the total amounts due by each federal agency.



Billing Process

- Federal agencies have 30 days after receipt of the bill from DOL to pay.
- DOL receives the funds from the federal agency and deposits them into the FEC account.
- Upon request, states furnish federal agencies with a quarterly listing of detailed benefit payment data (quarterly statements) that support the charges billed by the 25th day after the end of the quarter.
- Federal agencies use the quarterly statements to dispute incorrect charges and to reconcile the statements with the bill sent by DOL.
- States have 2 years to make corrections to UCFE charges.



DoD Responsibilities

- Review the quarterly statements to ensure the total matches the DOL bill and protest incorrect charges with the states.
- Follow up on outstanding protested charges until the credits have been received or the 2 year deadline occurs.
- Request missing quarterly statements.
- Upload DOL bills and the states' quarterly statements in DIUCS.
- Update DIUCS with information related to protested charges.
- Keep leadership informed of expenditures and credits.



Federal State Data Exchange System (FSDES)

- FSDES is a system created by DOL to allow states and federal agencies to communicate electronically for UCFE purposes.
- Currently FSDES is only used for UCFE billing but will be expanded to claims.
- The billing part of FSDES is called the Federal State Data Exchange Billing or FSDEB.
- Currently 29 of 53 states and 119 of 177 federal agencies use FSDES



FSDES State Responsibilities

- Maintain and update their state contact information
- Quarterly upload the quarterly statements
- Acknowledge all federal agency protests
- For protests, upload documents proving charge is correct
- Respond to federal agency comments within a timely manner



FSDES Federal Agency Responsibilities

- Maintain and update contact information
- Download quarterly statements
- Protest inaccurate charges
- Review and respond timely to state comments



UC Billing Issues

- States not charging the correct FIC
- States not providing credits within the 2 year deadline
- States not responding to protests
- States send billing documents to the wrong address
